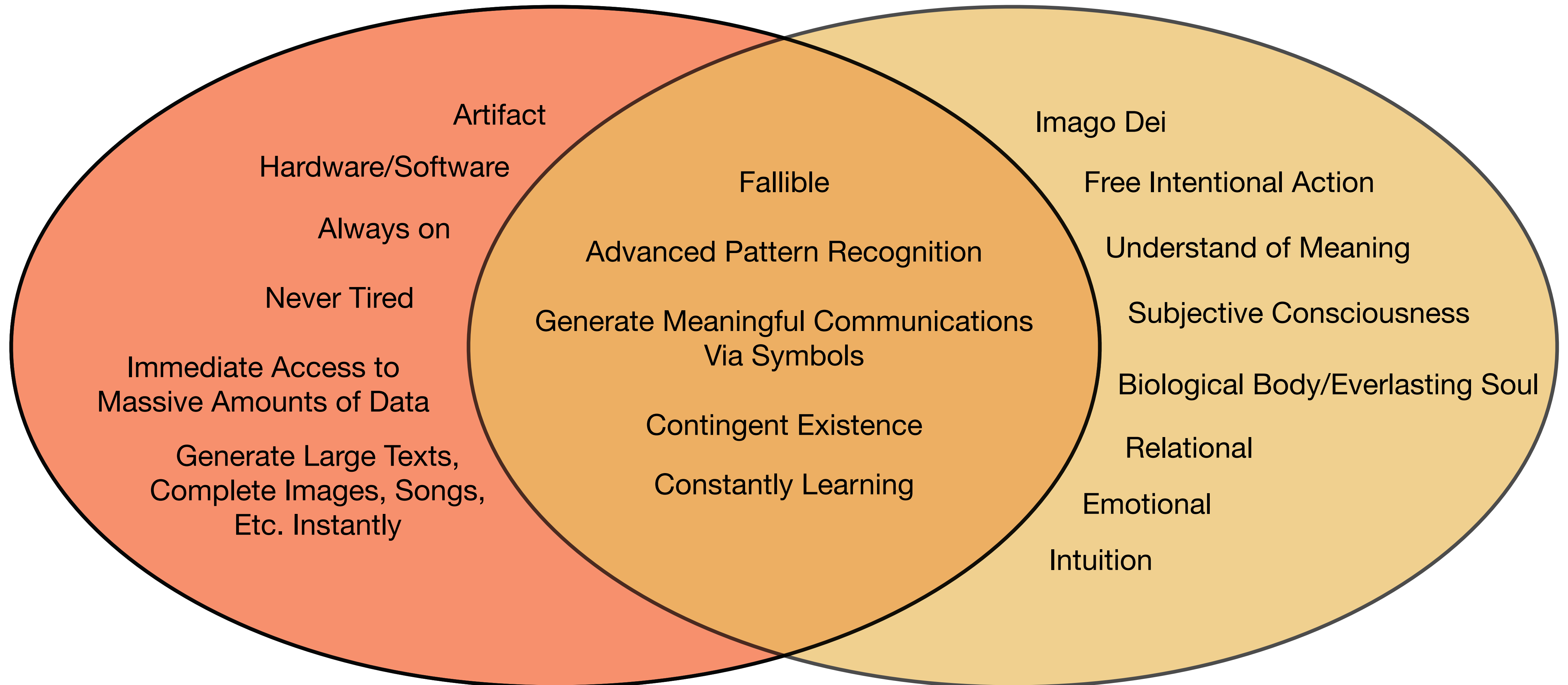

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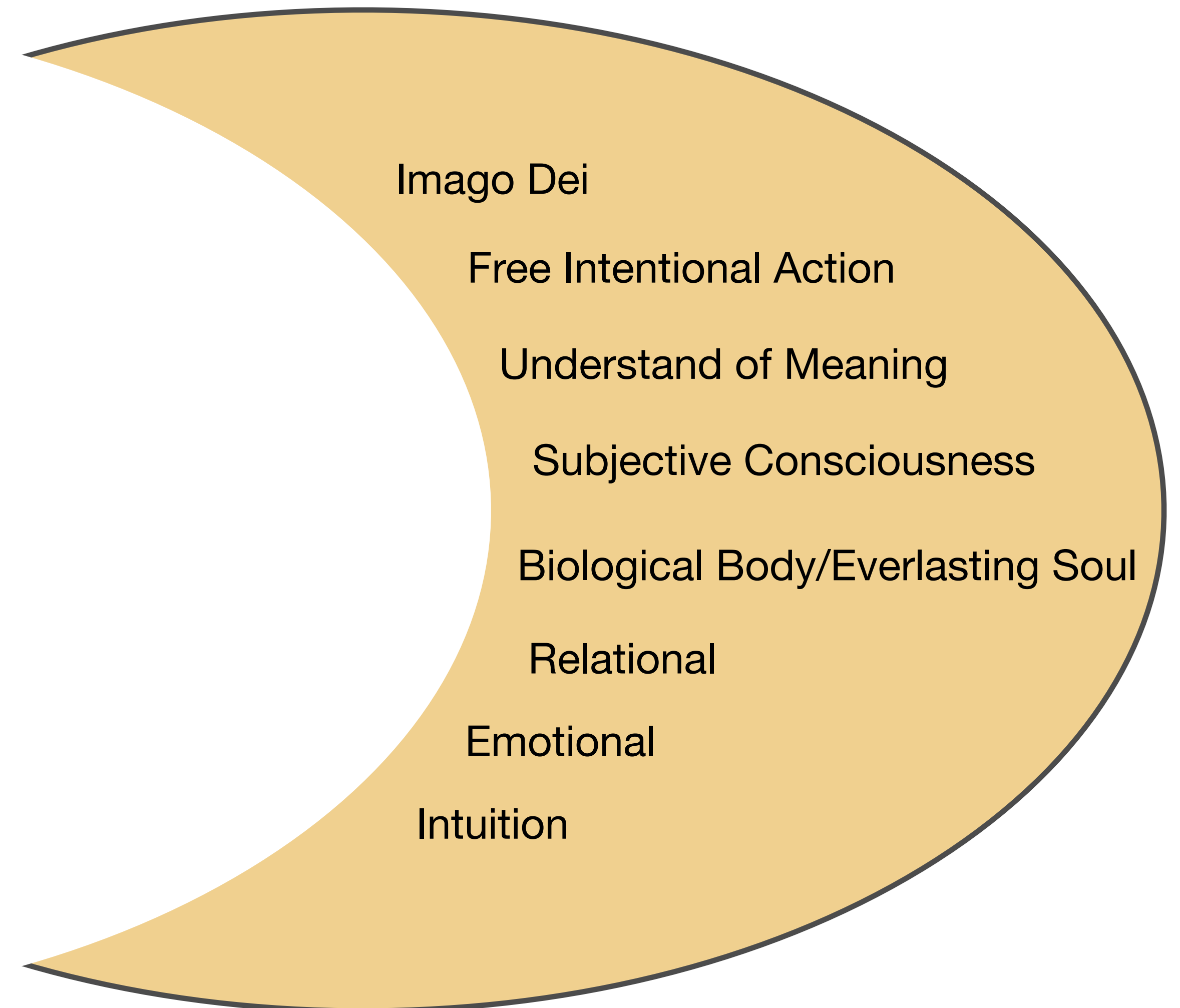
# Dangers for Christian Education

- Cheating and short-circuiting moral, intellectual, and aesthetic growth
- Erosion of truth - deception, deep fakes, propaganda, polarization, disinformation, slander, etc.
- Disembodiment
- Social detachment - AI replaces discipleship
- Fear of being **replaceable** by machines - increasing anxiety, depression, hopelessness, aimlessness
- Shifting role and status of the teacher

# Opportunities for Christian Education

- Focus on cultivating distinctively human qualities and abilities
- Leverage AI to extend reach and deepen impact
- Free up teacher and administrator time to focus on student and teacher flourishing
- Equip graduates for the new AI-infused economy



# Cultivating Well-formed Humans

- Love of God and neighbor - Christian character
- Discern wisdom and set goals - What ends should we pursue? What values and principles should govern our goal-setting?
- Create personally and communally meaningful art and communication
- Design creative solutions to complex human problems
- Pursue embodied excellence - craft, sport, visual and performing art
- Relational, emotional, mental health



# Collaborating with Good AI

- General knowledge base
- Data analysis and synthesis
- Basic language, image, music, video generation
- Assistance with creative projects
- Curriculum content generation
- Knowledge/skill tutoring
- Personalized knowledge and skill assessment

# Impact on Online Education

- Asynchronous online education, insofar as it transmits knowledge, constructs curriculum, and assesses knowledge and skill will be largely replaced by AI.
- Christian/Biblical worldview with well-designed AI's and minimal human input will be possible.
- Exclusively asynchronous online education is not well-suited to achieve the higher goals that will equip students for the future of work and prevent them from becoming replaceable by machines.

# Assessment Must Change

- What we assess - knowledge and skill still important,, but the ultimate goal is to assess students on their demonstration of **distinctively human qualities and abilities**
- How we assess - the legitimacy of graded homework and completely asynchronous online education will diminish rapidly due to ease of uncatchable cheating
- Shift to oral assessment, live competitions/debates/demos when we want to be sure the student has achieved enduring understanding
- Create assessments that require students to collaborate with AI to achieve outcomes that are only possible if they make **distinctively human contributions**



# What We're Doing at Gravititas
